#### **ABC FACTS**

**MISSION:** To provide scholarships to academically talented minority girls from underserved areas allowing them to realize their academic and social potential while living in Darien and attending DHS.

**ENROLLMENT:** Six girls currently from New York, and New Jersey.

**HISTORY:** Twenty-six years in Darien; 36 girls have graduated from the program

WHERE DO THEY GO? Graduates have entered colleges such as Columbia, Cornell, UVA and Syracuse.

**STAFF:** Two resident directors, cook, tutors, and part-time Program Director as needed.

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS:** Twenty-eight local residents.

**HOST FAMILIES:** Twelve families host the girls two weekends each month.

**RESIDENCE:** 11 Brookside Road—provided by the First Congregational Church, maintained by ABC Darien.

**THE BUDGET:** \$135,000 per year, covering staff, food, utilities, house maintenance, enrichment expenses and supplies.


