ABC IN DARIEN FACTS

MISSION: To provide scholarships to academically talented girls of color from underserved areas allowing them to realize their academic and social potential while living in Darien and attending DHS.

ENROLLMENT: Six girls currently from Connecticut, New York, New Jersey and Georgia.

HISTORY: Thirty-two years in Darien; 41 girls have graduated from the program.

WHERE DO THEY GO? Graduates have entered colleges such as Columbia, Cornell, George Washington, Syracuse and Wesleyan.

STAFF: Two Resident Directors, Executive Director & Tutors.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS: Twenty-four local residents.

HOST FAMILIES: Seven families host the girls one weekend and one Sunday each month.

RESIDENCE: 11 Brookside Road—provided by the First Congregational Church, maintained by ABC in Darien.

THE BUDGET: \$140,000 per year, covering staff, food, utilities, house maintenance, enrichment expenses and supplies.
